

A Word From Our Pastor



"Love Is More Than Words"

"Everyone will know you as My followers if you demonstrate your love to others." – Jesus

These words taken from the gospel of John are a powerful reminder to us all of what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ. Often in our society, the meaning of "becoming a Christian" has been deconstructed into a one-time faith decision, with the hopes of securing a place in heaven after death. However, this is not the type of faith that Jesus describes here in this phrase. Faith in Christ was never intended to be a passive decision. Being a follower of Christ signifies an unending, active, and participatory response by the believer.

Jesus is telling us that everyone will know that Christ is within you only when you first love others. In other words, to be called a disciple of Christ, it must be seen in our actions and not just heard by our words. The change of our heart and soul that occurred when we first accepted Christ (justification) should be known through our active love for others.

If we are not loving the world around us as a Christ follower, it is much like a person who receives a great inheritance, but fails to share this great reward with those around them before they die.


In the early church, those who became followers of Jesus were called "followers of the Way." These early Christians were convinced that the way they lived out their faith would impact the world around them. If the good news of Jesus was going to be spread around the world, as they were commanded to do, they knew it started with them. Jesus fully exemplified this type of love through his own sacrifice for humanity on a cross, as he revealed to the world that he truly was the way, the truth, and the life.

This February, as the celebration of "the month of love" is in the air, I hope we can be a people who

illustrate Christ's love to everyone we meet. Love is more than words is not just a popular song lyric from the 90's. It is a way, as followers of Christ, to demonstrate the transformational way of Jesus into a world who so desperately needs it. This type of love is without condition. This means loving your neighbor Who doesn't look like you, loving the poor, and even loving the person who may have wronged you. So, this season I pray that we may reveal Christ in all we do and choose to simply love better.
